

What to do...

Work with a partner. Choose a times table (not 1, 2 or 10).

1. Write out the times table, e.g. $1 \times 3 = 3$, $2 \times 3 = 6$, etc.
2. Say the first answer aloud, and write a rhyming word, e.g. three, bee.
3. Say the second answer and write a rhyming word, six, bricks.
4. Keep going down the table, saying each answer and writing a rhyming word each time.
5. Find someone in your family (not your partner) and show them the list of rhyming words.
6. Can they guess the times table?

Bring your lists of rhyming words into school.



Able tables!

We are having a push at learning our 3x, 4x, 5x and 6x tables.

Encourage your child to pick one of these tables, and help them to find good rhyming words!

The more humorous the better – it might help them remember the multiples!
